Dear Friends,

Alleluia, Christ is risen! Happy Easter!

Easter eggs may have all been eaten, hot cross buns finished, but we continue to celebrate this great feast of hope and life and love.

I'm sure you know the Easter season is 50 days long, 40 days till Ascension Day on 26 May, then a further 10 till Pentecost. The first 8 days are the most special, which the Book of Common Prayer makes very clear with special set readings for each day and not just for the Sunday.

This year that has caused some confusion with regards to the date of the celebration of St George, patron saint of England, normally on 23 April, which of course would have been within the first week of Easter. In the rubrics of the Church of England about the liturgical calendar the religious observance of St George's Day changes when it is too close to Easter. According to the Church of England's calendar, when St George's Day falls between Palm Sunday and the Second Sunday of Easter inclusive, it is moved to the Monday after the Second Sunday of Easter. But even that was not to happen this year, as that Monday was already taken by a more important saint. It definitively caused some challenges for flag masters!

The saints in the week after Easter week, some of whom were playing catch up, are as follows: Monday was for Mark the Evangelist,

Tuesday for St George,

Wednesday for Christina Rossetti,

Thursday for Peter Chanel, a martyred missionary in Vanuatu,

Friday will be Catherine of Siena,

and Saturday is the commemoration of Pandita Mary Ramabia, who translated the bible into Marathi.

All these saints, martyrs and inspirational people lived out the hope and joy of Easter, each in their own unique way. We are simply asked to do the same, to find our own unique way of living as Easter people. Some will do that through art, others through generous giving and caring, some in prayer, others through serving on Church Committees or the PCC. What will be your way?

Easter is that great reminder that God has given us new opportunities, given us new life out of love for us. Do you remember that song which some of you may have sung at school: "Love is something if you give it away.... it ends up being more"? Our response to Easter is just that, accepting God's love and then freely sharing it, without any hesitation. This is the time of loves.

Church Services:

We recommend you wear a mask in church as it's an enclosed space and we are continuing to care for each other.

Holy Communion is now being offered again in two kinds, i.e. the bread and the wine, to those who wish to receive both. However, those who would prefer to continue to receive the bread only, will still make a full communion.

We have received clear advice that 'intincting' (i.e. dipping wafer into wine) should be discouraged as there is a higher risk of contamination this way than from receiving directly from the chalice.

If you have any questions about receiving communion, please do talk to your clergy.

St John the Divine's Sunday service at 11.00am is both in-person and live-streamed via their Facebook page.

St John's midweek service takes place on Tuesday evenings with half an hour of quiet contemplation focused on the Blessed Sacrament at 6.30pm, followed by the Said Eucharist at 7.00pm.

St Mary Magdalene's Sunday services are at 8.00am, 9.30am, 11.30am (third Sunday only) and 6.30pm. The 9.30am service will also be live-streamed via their <u>Facebook page</u>. Apologies if the live-streams on 8 and 15 May are not available, due to the vicar's holiday.

During the week there is a Said Eucharist at 10.00am on Wednesdays.

St Matthias' 9.30am Sunday service is an in-person service. The midweek Eucharist at St Matthias is held on Thursdays at 10.00am.
