Dear Friends,

This letter comes to you in the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, which is traditionally observed from the 18th to the 25th January, ending with the Feast of the Conversion of St Paul. This year the Week of Prayer explores how the work of Christian unity can contribute to the promotion of racial justice across all levels of society. The work of restoring hope through justice continues to inspire and change lives for the better. With other Christians around the world during this Week of Prayer we pray that our hearts will be open to see and hear the many ways in which racism continues to destroy lives, and to discern the steps we can take as individuals and communities to heal the hurts and build a better future for everyone.

Sadly, in Richmond we no longer have a network of Christian Churches who come together to pray, worship or work. So maybe this year, we can pray for the churches in our own team, especially for St John the Divine during the vacancy, which is a time of change and also challenge.

Prayer for all at St John's:

Lord Jesus Christ, Head of the Church, the work of the church of St John the Divine is yours. In this time of waiting, strengthen all who worship at St John's through your strength and with patience they may faithfully serve you and grow in knowing you and your will in their lives.

For the past few weeks an advert for a new Team Vicar at St John the Divine has been in the Church Times, both in the hard copy and on-line (https://jobs.churchtimes.co.uk/jobs/Team-Vicar-in-London-and-Home-Counties-in 10799). This has already sparked quite some interest and it has been very encouraging to talk to priests who are considering whether St John's is the place God is calling them to.

The process of appointment is not like a regular job interview, but very much a discernment process for all involved. The question both the candidates and the church need to ask themselves is "Is this what God wants for me, for us? Can we together serve God and community?" The closing date for applications is at the end of this month. Then shortlisting will take place on 9 February, chaired by the Archdeacon of Wandsworth. On Saturday 25 February the shortlisted candidates will have the opportunity to look around the churches and meet representatives before formal interviews take place on I March. Representatives of St John's and of the Team, together with the Archdeacon and the Dean of King's College, Cambridge, will form the interview panel.

Shepherd of souls, give to us for the leadership of your Church in St John the Divine and the Richmond Team

a person after your own heart:

one of faith and prayer, filled with the Spirit;

one of vision, wisdom and sound judgment;

one with a pastoral heart and a true love for people.

Prepare the person of your choice for their ministry among us, and prepare us for their coming; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Some people have asked me how this post is funded as for a number of years it was a half time post and now we hope to appoint a full time priest. The Diocese will provide the house, on Old Deer Park Gardens, and the Richmond Team will pay the stipend, the money coming from the investment of the sale proceeds of St John's Hall on Church Road. We are blessed to have these resources at our disposal for the mission of God's Church.

Church Services:

St John the Divine's Sunday service at 11.00am is both in-person and live-streamed via their <u>Facebook page</u>.
