Dear Friends,

My journey of Lent, up to the Triduum, has been bookended by two films. On the afternoon of Ash Wednesday, I went and watched *Zone of Interest*, which focuses on the life of Nazi commandant Rudolf Höss and his wife Hedwig, who live with their family in a home next to the Auschwitz concentration camp. Their garden wall is the wall of the camp. The towers and chimneys are visible above it. Throughout the film the quiet, churning background noise of the death and agony next door is ignored by the characters. At night the sky is red. And yet, they carry on their lives: playing in the pool, tending to the garden. At one point Hedwig calls their home 'paradise'.

And, yesterday, I watched *The Passion of the Christ* for the first time. An imperfect film, but what struck me was the way that individual sin and corporate sin are mixed up together. As in *Zone of Interest*, individual selfishness (as of Rudolf or Hedwig, Judas or Pilate) is a tiny cog in a great machine of collective sin which grinds and destroys. Empires which oppress, grand systems of injustice, in which all are complicit.

For the most part, we have a handle on what individual sin looks like. However, we tend to think less often about collective sin.

We were all made startlingly aware during the pandemic of how completely our lives are entwined, and how much we rely on great unseen and unacknowledged systems which enable our lives to function. And again, when we think about Climate Change: as a society we have developed systems which benefit oil companies, which reward shipping trees across the world in order to burn them. In the book which our Lent Groups read, Selina Stone writes about generational trauma and systems of injustice: how we inherit and perpetuate systems which oppress and exclude based on race, poverty, class, gender, sexuality, age... We all buy into and benefit from these systems (even if we also suffer from them) in ways that it is easier to ignore, like the chimneys in the background, the groaning of the machine. We live within them.

If this reflection feels overwhelming, unfair, unbearable, unjust – I can completely understand that. That is how I feel too. I want to push off those corporate sins, to disown them. But I recognise that I participate in them and benefit from them, as well as suffering from them. I even use the vast darkness of them to shade my own sin: what does it matter, if I don't recycle this bottle, if I buy something I know was made in a sweatshop, if I say nothing about unjust healthcare, if I don't protest international arms sales? It's just a drop in a vast ocean of sin.

As we reflect on the cross, over the next three days, we remember that it is not just our individual sins which Jesus bears there, but the overwhelming weight of collective sin. "It is for freedom that Christ has set us free," not just as individuals but collectively. The Kingdom of God, is free from systems of oppression and violence. That is the Kingdom which we seek and strive for. That is the hope which is won for us on the cross. Though our sin is overwhelming, God's love overwhelms it.

Further investigation into the damage to the round pillar at the back of church (nearest the prayer board) and the beam above it have revealed more extensive damage. Significant work is required to make the necessary repairs. This will involve scaffolding to allow further investigation before a solution for repair can be suggested. We aim to sheet the area off whilst this is in place. The church wardens are continuing to work with the RTM Property Manager; the architect; and the diocese, to ensure that these repairs can take place as soon as possible. The church is safe and will remain open.
