Dear Friends,

Walking along a familiar path in Kew Gardens I stopped and breathed in the air around me, my senses suddenly becoming awakened by the newness of the spring day. I realised how thankful I was that God had carried me through the dark and dreary winter months. My ears tuned into the chorus of singing birds; my eyes dazzled with the soft golden splendour of bulbs starting to unfold after pushing themselves through the hard winter surface, their glory for all to see. The long cold winter months will soon become a distant memory to us all, as the days grow longer and we can feel a touch of warmth in the air around us.

I was reminded of the C.S. Lewis story *The Lion, The Witch and the Wardrobe* and the prophecy of Aslan's return:

"Wrong will be right, when Aslan comes in sight, At the sound of his roar, sorrows will be no more, When he bares his teeth, winter meets its death, And when he shakes his mane, we shall have spring again."

Throughout the unfolding events in the Narnia books, when Aslan steps on the scene, peoples' hearts are changed, even if the circumstances don't change immediately. And often, that is how God meets us in our own trials first. Changing our hearts by His presence, even if our circumstances don't look different yet.

The Song of Songs (2.11-13) says "Look, the winter is past, and the rains are over and gone. The flowers are springing up, the season of singing birds has come, and the cooing of turtledoves fills the air. The fig trees are forming young fruit, and the fragrant grapevines are blossoming. Rise up, my darling! Come away with me, my fair one!" Let us each thank the Lord for this new season that is unfolding around us.

Let us notice the signs of fresh life and dance with abundant joy in our hearts that God is with us, beckoning us to follow him on our Eastertide adventure.

Lord, we thank you for being a beacon of light and keeping us safe during times of darkness. Help us to leave the winter behind us and step forward with you. This is a season full of hope, as new life emerges from the natural world around us. Let us fall deeper in love with you, as we draw closer to your heart and keep our focus on you alone. Let us take hold of each new day with open eyes and hearts. Help us to be fruitful and grow stronger in our faith, embracing all that is ahead. Even though we may still have challenges and times of difficulties this spring, let us look to you, our keeper, for guidance through the mist. Amen.

We are very pleased to share with you that, finally, planning permission for the work on the Parish Rooms has been granted! Now we are working with the architect and others to make all the final prep.

#### St Mary's church building

Further investigation into the damage to the round pillar at the back of church (nearest the prayer board) and the beam above it have revealed more extensive damage. Significant work is required to make the necessary repairs. This will involve scaffolding to allow further investigation before a solution for repair can be suggested. We aim to sheet the area off whilst this is in place. The church wardens are continuing to work with the RTM Property Manager; the architect; and the diocese, to ensure that these repairs can take place as soon as possible. The church is safe and will remain open.
