In order to help us express our care for God's World, as you know our three churches have joined a Rocha Ecochurch Scheme. The EcoChurch vision is for churches of all denominations to care for creation as an integral part of loving their neighbours and following God faithfully. All three churches are now working Beyond Bronze! We are each aiming to gain the Silver award by the end of 2024. We have already achieved Gold level in terms of our worship and teaching which of course is a very important section.

So what have the Green Team been doing over the last few months? As part of the Global Recycling Day (18 March) we collected all your old prescription glasses and sunglasses. We sent an incredible 149 sets to the Lions Club who wash them, grade them and then send them directly to children and adults in other less developed countries – well done all those who donated. Become 'specs savers' and we will do this again next year!



We had a Litter Picking session after a morning service at St Marys to celebrate World Earth Day (22 April). You would be amazed what we found – a (toy) crown, a swimming pool float

and a sofa cushion to name but a few. Thanks to all those who attended including one furry friend and there will be another opportunity in September to join us again in tidying the churchyard as part of our plans for World Clean Up Day (15 September).





Our young people made amazing and enormous Easter cards — one for each church - so that we could share Easter Greetings in a more environmentally friendly way. We do so hope you enjoyed seeing their creations, adding your Easter messages and of course helping to save the planet by reducing the number of individual cards we send.

The Green Team is a group made up of clergy and congregation members from all three churches. We meet every few months to plan how to both work towards Silver status in the Ecochurch Scheme but also to ensure we care for God's earth irrespective of external awards. RECYCLING IDEAS

Cosmetics & Medication packages

Some of things we find most difficult to recycle are the small cosmetic packaging such as lipsticks and mascara tubes. Some are so tiny they would be lost in our kerbside recycling and some are made of composite materials. There is good news you can now take these



back to many high street shops including Boots the Chemist and some Sainsburys. Superdrug, another high street pharmacy will also take back medication blister packs. The medication cardboard packaging and plastic bottles can all go in the kerbside waste. Don't forget though to take unused mediations back to the pharmacy counter for safe disposal.



Pink Bins

You can now recycle your unwanted small electrical items in Richmond at one of the 20 new PINK bins or with your weekly kerbside collection. Anything with a plug, battery or a cable up to the size of a two-slice toaster can be recycled and turned into something new through this scheme. Research suggests we each have up to 30 unwanted electrical items hidden at home and 39% of us put these in the waste rather than recycle – no excuses now!

No Idling

Leaving your car engines running when stationary is not only illegal but a huge cause of air pollution and can impact on our health.
