Dear Friends,

Or, if you're eager to learn something new now, perhaps you'll be joining the Anti-Racism Charter Parish study sessions, with Joe on Wednesday mornings (see below!). Or pop the next set of Bible Studies (Hebrews, 2, 9, 16, 23 Oct) in the diary!

I am always impressed by the joy which people in RTM derive from continuing to learn, and the investments which you make in challenging and stretching yourselves. So, the twilight of this academic year might be the time to plan in something new, and perhaps treat yourself to a new pencil case!

Racial Injustice

The Richmond Team Ministry has been asked by the Diocese of Southwark to use the pilot Anti-Racism Charter Parish study resource. We will then offer our feedback.

In July we will have an opportunity to explore how we might actively counter, disrupt, and oppose racial injustice wherever we find it in our churches, workplaces and communities.

Joe will lead these four sessions on Wednesdays after the 10am Eucharist at St Mary Magdalene, beginning at 11am and finishing at 12:15pm. These sessions will offer an opportunity to reflect deeply on our own views and assumptions and explore our calling as disciples of Christ.

Session 1: In Christ and as Christ - Wednesday 3rd July Session 2: Rebuilding the city - Wednesday 10th July Session 3: The trees that we have to climb - Wednesday 17th July Session 4: Putting it all together and into action - Wednesday 24th July

Church Services:

Children's Service at St Mary Magdalene

The next Children's service will be on Saturday 6 July at 4pm at The Vicarage. This service is for all children from the Richmond Team! It will take the form of a picnic, with games, songs. Bring a small amount of food to share, if you can.

St John the Divine's Sunday service at 11.00am is both in-person and live-streamed via their <u>Facebook page</u>. You can watch the service live as it happens, or once it is uploaded. There is a Said Eucharist at 10.00am every Wednesday, followed by coffee.

St Matthias' 9.30am Sunday service is an in-person service. The midweek Eucharist at St Matthias is held on Thursdays at 10.00am and is followed by coffee and biscuits. Everyone is very welcome to join us. Please note there will be no Eucharist on Thursday 4 July, as the church is being used as a polling station for the general election.
