Dear Friends,

This week I had the joy of spending three days in Brussels visiting some friends. I enjoyed some beer, some churches, some chocolate, and a lot of art. I delighted in Magritte ("Ceci n'est pas une pipe"); enjoyed (and was unnerved by) 100 years of Surrealism; appreciated the cluttered and festering still-lives of the Dutch School; wondered around the Old Masters' Gallery, spotting a Hieronymus Bosch at 10 paces and seeking out depictions of Mary Magdalene.

This weekend, St Mary Magdalene's marks our patronal festival, with three celebratory services in the morning (8am, 9:30, 11:30) and the ever-popular Hymns and Pimms at 6:30pm. In the run up to this feast I have been thinking a lot about depictions of Mary Magdalene (and other saints) in art.

Walking around the Old Masters' gallery, after the sometimes jarring disconnection of the surrealists, felt a little formulaic at first. The faces and expressions of the saints seemed the same in painting after painting. But then I saw a depiction of the disciples (men and women) tending to Christ's body, all in a row reminiscent of the Last Supper. And one of Mary Magdalene prostrate at the foot of the cross. And I looked more closely at the works which I assumed I knew.

And, during a second lap, at the people I assumed I knew. I had entirely ignored the other visitors in the galleries until this thought occurred to me, but on this walk around I noticed them and wondered about their lives. Each person, in their full depth and complexity, known and loved by God.

I came back to Blighty, thinking about how God has made us for creativity and connection. At the entrance to the Surrealism exhibition were a series of rooms which encouraged visitors to create. There were random household objects which could be combined into sculptures, a galaxy of stars ready to be joined into story-telling constellations, brasses and crayons to encourage playfulness with shape and colour. They were activities which everyone could engage with.

When I started the Art Afternoon reflections a number of people told me that they'd like to come but they're not artistic. That's as may be, but you are creative. You can make something new. Something which has never existed before. You just need the right materials.

On Monday, a number of us will be taking a trip to the National Gallery, to hunt down depictions of Mary Magdalene on her feast day. You are very welcome to come with us. And even if you don't, perhaps make some time this summer for a trip to a gallery. See what resonates with you; what challenges or rankles; in whom do you see yourself; with whom do you feel a sense of connection.

And perhaps you could create something. Something which didn't exist before you made it. Something which comes out of the depth and complexity of who you are, known and loved by God.

Church Services:

St John the Divine's Sunday service at 11.00am is both in-person and live-streamed via their <u>Facebook page</u>. St John's midweek service takes place on Tuesday evenings with half an hour of quiet contemplation focused on the Blessed Sacrament at 6.30pm, followed by the Said Eucharist at 7.00pm.
