Dear Friends,

Walking into St Matthias this morning for the midweek Eucharist, I was struck by how dark the interior was, the scaffolding on the outside of the building preventing the light from coming in, and on a dark and rainy day like this, the lack of light on the south side was quite pronounced. But without the scaffolding the builders wouldn't be able to repair our roof, and the rain running down the outside of the building this morning would soon be finding its way inside.

Scaffolding may look ugly and at the moment obscuring the light, but it's necessary so that work can be carried out safely, it makes the inaccessible accessible, it lifts us up so that we can see more clearly and closely, it allows us to see things we may never have seen before, it reveals the rot and exposes decay so that steps can be taken to repair and replace. Scaffolding enables us to build stronger and safer, keeping the foundations and fabric healthy. And it's not just builders who use scaffolding, an artist or sculptor would need to use scaffolding to help create spectacular works of art – it would have been impossible for Michaelangelo to paint the Sistine Chapel in Rome without the aid of scaffolding; the Normans couldn't have built our magnificent cathedrals without scaffolding in place. Stanley Spencer, speaking about his great picture of the resurrection of the soldiers, painted in the chapel at Burghclere, called the masses of crosses from the battlefield which are piled high across the central part of the piece, a "sort of scaffolding" – the risen Christ, the Master-Builder, taking each one from men's hands as they reached him and received peace at last.

Scaffolding is a great symbol for us as we consider the ways in which we build up our spiritual life. We need structural support if we are to build a faith which is worth having, which lifts us closer to God, a faith which strengthens and sustains and supports our lives, especially through the challenges and tough times. We construct scaffolding all the time to enable us to see things more clearly and to build up the 'house not made with hands', the temple of the Holy Spirit. We use all sorts of things as scaffolding material – scripture, prayer, liturgy, poetry and literature, art, music, life's experiences – all help to build us up in faith and grow in hope.

So what of our own spiritual scaffolding? How do our religious practices, ie our prayer life, our worship, our learning, our being together as a community, our outreach etc, build up faith in ourselves, in the Church, in our community? Does the scaffolding we have in place lift us to new heights, and show us where we need to heal and mend and repair? Does it provide opportunities to see God more clearly and perhaps allow for changes to be made and even some new building to take place?

I hope your ponderings lead you to some interesting discoveries and pray that the light of the Spirit will shine through and inspire, challenge and comfort us as we grow, learn, mend and build together.
