Dear Friends,

The set Gospel for the Second Sunday of Epiphany tells the story of 'the first of the signs that Jesus did and manifested forth his glory'; the transformation of water into wine at the wedding at Cana (John 2:1-11). I love this miracle, though John doesn't call it a miracle, he rightly calls it a sign. It is a sign that points to so many profound and liberating things about the God whom Jesus reveals to us; His delight in and concern for our own personal life and loves, attested by His presence at the wedding feast, His abundant generosity in more than meeting our needs in the midst of everyday life, His call to us to move from the mere outward purity, symbolised by the water for ritual washing, to a transformation of inward joy, symbolised by the wine. But most importantly, this sign points to the gift of His very self, His own heart's blood, given once for all on the cross and received by us in the sacrament of Holy Communion.

I wonder though, if in the cold January light, it feels as if in some way we can see and name situations in which we "have no wine" and places in which "the wine gave out." We may see it happening in our lives, our institutions, our country, and our world. Yet, we know that when we feel like the wine has given out, we are invited to drink of the cup which overflows, the life-giving chalice of salvation, given to us in Jesus.

#### Repairs Update at St Mary Magdalene

Good news! And not so good news! The good news is that the Chancellor has given the go-ahead for the repairs to be carried out to the damaged beam in the Nave at St Mary's, which is currently shrouded in scaffolding. However, this was subject to approval of the scheme of works by Richmond Council and Heritage England. The Council have given their approval, but, and here is the not so good news, Heritage England have objected. Meetings will be held shortly between structural engineers to hopefully agree how the repair should be carried out and with what materials, but unfortunately this will lead to a delay to the start of the works.

## **Church Services:**

**St John the Divine**'s Sunday service at 11.00am is both in-person and live-streamed via their <u>Facebook page</u>. St John's midweek service takes place on Tuesday evenings with half an hour of quiet contemplation focused on the Blessed Sacrament at 6.30pm, followed by the Said Eucharist at 7.00pm. **St Matthias**' 9.30am Sunday service is an in-person service. The midweek Eucharist at St Matthias is held on Thursdays at 10.00am and is followed by coffee and biscuits. Everyone is very welcome to join us.
