Dear Friends,

Today the Church remembers George Herbert, one of England's foremost Christian priest-poets. George was born in Montgomeryshire, Wales in 1593 to a wealthy and influential family. He spent most of his growing up years in England, and after a successful academic career at Cambridge, and a spell sitting as the member of parliament for Montgomery, he was ordained into the Church of England and was priested in 1629. He first held the living at Leighton Bromswold, near his friend Nicholas Ferrar's community at Little Gidding in Lincoln Diocese, and then in 1630 he moved to be parish priest at Bemerton, near Salisbury. It was at Bemerton that he found inspiration to write his notable guide to rural ministry, 'The Country Parson', a description of the pattern of life and ministry to which he aspired (and which sadly is now but a pipe dream for parish priests working in a very different world). George believed that fundamentally a priest's good conduct, loving service and kindness of heart preached the most powerful sermon and would draw his parishioners to God far better than any clever use of words from the pulpit. But it has to be said that it's for poetry that George is best remembered, and his carefully crafted words continue to inspire and sustain faith today. As I've pondered his life and ministry I've been struck by just how influential his ideal of priesthood has been on the Church and on priestly formation in the Church of England, despite his early death at the age of 39, after only three years of active ministry. How many of us will be remembered for our spiritual guidance and insight 400 years after our death?!!

One of George Herbert's best-loved poems explores Christ's invitation to the Eucharist, and today seems the perfect day to offer it in preparation for our own worship this coming weekend:

Love

Love bade me welcome; yet my soul drew back, guilty of dust and sinne.

But quick-eye'd Love, observing me grow slack from my first entrance in, drew near to me, sweetly questioning If I lack'd any thing.

A guest, I answer'd, worthy to be here:
Love said, You shall be he.
I, the unkinde, ungrateful? Ah my deare,
I cannot look on thee.
Love took my hand, and smiling did reply,
who made the eyes but I?

Truth Lord, but I have marr'd them: let my shame go where it doth deserve.

And know you not, says Love, who bore the blame?

My deare, then I will serve.

You must sit down, says Love, and taste my meat:

So I did sit and eat.
