Dear Friends,

Christ is risen. He is risen indeed. Alleluia!

As the light of Easter continues to break through the shadows of our world, I write with both joy and some sorrow in my heart—joy at the radiant hope of the Resurrection, and sorrow at the death of Pope Francis, a pastor whose life and ministry touched hearts far beyond the Roman Catholic fold. His Holiness Pope Francis was a man of the Gospel—a shepherd who smelled of his sheep, a bishop of Rome who leaned not on splendour or spectacle but on mercy, humility, and the fierce clarity of love. He stood in the tradition of St Peter, yet spoke in the voice of St Francis, calling the Church—indeed, calling all of us—back to the simple power of the Beatitudes. In his encyclicals and homilies, in his witness for the poor, for migrants, for the Earth and for peace, Pope Francis reminded us that the Gospel is not an ornament but a summons: to go out, to kneel down, to begin again.

Even in death, such a witness does not fade. It is transfigured, as in the Resurrection of our Lord. Easter is not the denial of suffering, nor is it naïve optimism. It is the unshakable proclamation that God has entered the depths of human grief—and has broken its power. “The last enemy to be destroyed is death,” St Paul writes (1 Corinthians 15.26), and in the risen Christ we see that death, though still present, is no longer ultimate.

The empty tomb does not erase the cross, but it transforms it.

The scars remain in his hands, but they shine now with glory.

In this light, I find myself reflecting anew on our relationships with Christians beyond our own tradition. The death of a Pope may feel like news from “elsewhere” to some Anglicans, but it is also a moment that calls us to a deeper awareness of our belonging—to the one Body of Christ, fractured though it may be. “That they may all be one,” prayed our Lord in the garden (John 17.21), and every time we reach across denominational lines in friendship, collaboration, or shared witness, we participate in that prayer.

As the Church of God, we belong to one another. Whether we are celebrating the Eucharist, sharing in a community action, or standing in vigil for peace, we are part of a living tapestry—woven not by uniformity, but by charity, by mutual respect, and by the shared confession that Jesus Christ is Lord. Easter, then, is not simply a season. It is a lens—a way of seeing the world and the Church with eyes opened by resurrection light. It is a call to live as if death is not the end, as if mercy is stronger than judgement, as if love really does win. That’s not always easy, but it is always possible—because Christ is risen, and he goes before us.

So let us walk as people of the light. Let us pray for our Roman Catholic brothers and sisters in their time of mourning. Let us give thanks for the life of Pope Francis, and commit ourselves afresh to the work of unity, justice, and peace. And let us be an Easter people—bearing witness in word and deed to the truth that no tomb is too dark, no world too broken, for God’s light to shine through.

St Mary Magdalene – closure for works on the beam (28 April – 2 May)

St Mary Magdalene will be closed for one working week, while the messiest and most dangerous part of the repairs to the pillar and beam take place.

During that week:

Morning Prayer on Wednesday (30 April) will be held at St John's

Morning Prayer on Thursday (1 May) will be held at St Matthias

Wednesday morning Eucharist will be cancelled.

Following 5 days closure, all works will continue with the church open for prayer and visitors, and for all services as normal.

The Vacancy: Seeking a new Team Rector and Vicar of St Mary Magdalene

We have been reflecting on and praying for this vacancy, and about the qualities which we would like from a new Team Rector and Vicar of SMM for 4 months, and it is time for us to begin to collate all the thoughts and feedback. We are beginning the process of bringing together common themes, concerns and ideas for how we might best address the issues raised and take matters forward.

To that end, each church will want to convene a congregational meeting as soon as possible to discuss any matters which have not yet been voiced, about RTM and what we are looking for in a new Rector and Vicar: concerns, hopes, reflections, experiences, and joys! Conveners from each of the churches are organising these now.

The congregational meeting at SJD around the Team Rector vacancy will be on Sunday 4 May after the service

Following that, all three churches will meet together again, with a view to beginning work on a Parish Profile which reflects our wonderful Team Ministry, each of our churches, and the whole community in Richmond.

St Mary's will be holding a further congregational meeting at 4:30pm this Sunday (27 April) at SMM to discuss the above and to which members from St Matthias and St John's are warmly welcomed.

Electoral Roll Revision

The Annual Parochial Church Meeting and the three Annual Church Meetings will be held on 18 May this year and it is then that the church officers will be elected. Church officers are the Wardens, Deanery Synod Representatives, PCC lay members and Church Committee lay members.

As with national elections, we have to have an electoral roll for this. As our existing roll is now 6 years old it is no longer valid, has to go into the bin and we have to create a new one. This means everyone who would like to vote has to enrol; your name will not be brought forward from the old roll.

To enrol you need to complete an application form which will be available at the back of each church. The completed form should be left in the collection post box provided for these. Enrolment will continue up to and including Sunday 27 April.

Church Services:

St John the Divine's Sunday service at 11.00am is both in-person and live-streamed via their [Facebook page](#). St John's midweek service takes place on Tuesday evenings with half an hour of quiet contemplation focused on the Blessed Sacrament at 6.30pm, followed by the Said Eucharist at 7.00pm. The last Tuesday of the month our regular Said Eucharist at 7pm is a Eucharist for Healing and Wholeness, with the opportunity to receive the Ministry of Laying on of Hands with Prayer and Anointing for yourself or to receive it on someone else's behalf. All are welcome.

St Mary Magdalene's Sunday services are at 8.00am, 9.30am, 11.30am (third Sunday only) and 6.30pm. Our 9.30am service will be live-streamed via [St Mary Magdalene Facebook page](#). You can watch the service live as it happens, or once it is uploaded. There is a Said Eucharist at 10.00am every Wednesday, followed by coffee.

St Matthias' 9.30am Sunday service is an in-person service. The midweek Eucharist at St Matthias is held on Thursdays at 10.00am and is followed by coffee and biscuits. Everyone is very welcome to join us.
