Dear Friends,

On my way to take the Eucharist at St Matthias this morning I heard a sound which made me stop and look up.... and there soaring away above my head was a sight for sore eyes: the first Swifts of the summer, heralding their arrival with their unmistakable screech as they tore up the sky, their little bodies full of energy despite the hundreds of miles they've travelled to reach our shores. Who knows what dangers they've encountered, or friends they've lost along the way, but here they are, filling our world with happy noise and the promise of warm summer days ahead.

I've been reading a gentle little book recently with my early morning tea, written by Michael Morpurgo called 'Spring': the story of a season. Michael lives on a farm in deepest rural Devon, and he writes about the coming of spring and the creatures, the sights and the sounds which bring us pockets of hope and joy as the earth stirs in to life at this time of year. He writes about swifts and other migrating birds, about newly returned otters to the river near his home, and the sunsnoozing grass snakes newly awakened from their winter sleep. He paints a beautiful picture of woods carpeted with bluebells, and fields full of buttercups and daisies. And as I read Michael's words I'm transported back to my childhood, to picking bluebells for our school nature table, and a song we used to sing in assembly at infant school: 'Daisies are my silver, buttercups are gold, these are all the treasures that my heart can hold'. The tune we sang our song to is called 'Glenfinlas' and there is a beautiful hymn written for that same tune which we often sing at St Matthias during the distribution of holy communion. And when I look around me on this May day, when Richmond is all froth and blossom, daisies and buttercups, and the air filled with the scent of Wisteria, the lyrics of that hymn come to me too, because they speak of Easter living, of finding hope and peace in a world where too many people are living without beauty, and where the only smell lingering in their nostrils is that of cordite, dust and sadly, death.

Celebrating my first sighting of the newly arrived swifts, and giving thanks for the beauty which surrounds me every day, and the indescribable joy of simply being alive at this time of year when resurrection glory is all around, I can't help but reflect on other migrants who might also be arriving on our shores after long and dangerous journeys, longing for beauty and peace and a place to safely rest their weary bodies, and I wonder what sort of reception they might receive. And Glenfinlas comes to my mind again, and the words of a hymn which brings comfort and hope:

'Come to me,' says Jesus, 'all who are distressed; Take my yoke upon you, I will give you rest'.

Hear the call of Jesus, Come, be deeply blessed; His the invitation, You the honoured guest.

Pardon, feed and heal us, Humble, courteous Lord, Gracious host, for ever Honoured and adored. Alan Gaunt (b1935)

Church Services:

St John the Divine's Sunday service at 11.00am is both in-person and live-streamed via their Facebook page. St John's midweek service takes place on Tuesday evenings with half an hour of quiet contemplation focused on the Blessed Sacrament at 6.30pm, followed by the Said Eucharist at 7.00pm. The last Tuesday of the month our regular Said Eucharist at 7pm is a Eucharist for Healing and Wholeness, with the opportunity to receive the Ministry of Laying on of Hands with Prayer and Anointing for yourself or to receive it on someone else's behalf. All are welcome.

There is a Said Eucharist at 10.00am every Wednesday, followed by coffee.

St Matthias' 9.30am Sunday service is an in-person service. The midweek Eucharist at St Matthias is held on Thursdays at 10.00am and is followed by coffee and biscuits. Everyone is very welcome to join us.
