Dear Friends,

This week, churches, schools, families, and workplaces across the country are marking Mental Health Awareness Week. Each year, we're invited to pause and reflect on our wellbeing—and this year's theme, "Community," feels especially timely and profoundly Christian.

In an age when loneliness has quietly become one of the most widespread struggles in society, the call to deeper community is both urgent and healing. Whether we live alone or in a busy household, whether we're surrounded by friends or struggling to connect, the truth is this: human beings are created for relationship. The God who made us in love also made us for love. In the first pages of Scripture, God looks upon Adam and says, "It is not good that the man should be alone" (Genesis 2.18). From the beginning, community is not a luxury - it is a necessity.

Mental ill-health can be deeply isolating. Depression, anxiety, grief, and trauma often convince us that we are alone in what we're going through. But the gospel assures us: you are not alone. Christ is always with us—and, crucially, Christ comes to us through other people. Through the friend who checks in. The neighbour who stops to chat. The church member who prays quietly beside you. In these small moments of connection, community becomes not an abstract ideal, but a living reality.

One of the Church's most powerful gifts is the ability to create spaces of belonging - spaces where people are received as they are, not as they wish they were. To love someone is to show to them their beauty, their worth and their importance." This, I believe, is one of the most sacred tasks we have as Christians: to remind one another of our God-given value, especially when the world - or our own inner voices - tell us otherwise.

The poet John Donne famously wrote, "No man is an island, entire of itself." It's a line often quoted, and rightly so, because it speaks to our deepest truth: we belong to one another. When one suffers, we all suffer. And when one begins to heal, that healing becomes a blessing for the whole body.

This week, perhaps you might reach out to someone you haven't seen for a while. Perhaps you yourself are in need of someone to listen. Don't be afraid to say so. You are not a burden - you are a beloved part of this community. And every person in our church family has something precious to offer.

As we hold one another in prayer this week, may we continue becoming the kind of community where it is safe to be real. Safe to struggle. Safe to hope. A place not of perfection, but of presence - and grace.

This year's theme for Thy Kingdom Come is 'Light up the world in prayer' and to mark the global wave of prayer, Southwark Diocese is inviting people to join a family-friendly celebration, which will take a place on Pentecost Sunday, 8 June 2025, from 3:00 to 5:00pm at Southwark Cathedral. We warmly invite you and your children to join us for a meaningful and multi-sensory celebration of the Holy Spirit, as part of *Thy Kingdom Come*.

The event will be specially designed by Rachael Gledhill (Associate Vicar of St John the Evangelist, Upper Norwood) and Sharon Moughtin (Vicar of St Mary in the Wilderness and author of Diddy Disciples). Church Services:

St John the Divine's Sunday service at 11.00am is both in-person and live-streamed via their Facebook page. St John's midweek service takes place on Tuesday evenings with half an hour of quiet contemplation focused on the Blessed Sacrament at 6.30pm, followed by the Said Eucharist at 7.00pm. The last Tuesday of the month our regular Said Eucharist at 7pm is a Eucharist for Healing and Wholeness, with the opportunity to receive the Ministry of Laying on of Hands with Prayer and Anointing for yourself or to receive it on someone else's behalf. There is a Said Eucharist at 10.00am every Wednesday, followed by coffee.
