Dear Friends,

Last Wednesday I spent a fabulous day at the Chelsea Flower Show. So many of the gardens this year were designed for charities who work to promote wellbeing and improve mental health, and were full of inspirational ideas which might be included in our much more modest gardens at home. My favourite gardens were those which were awash with colour and scent - foxgloves, roses, irises all at their very best at this time of year and displayed to utter perfection at Chelsea. Among the best of the show gardens were those which not only looked beautiful, but which also provided an insight into the benefits of being connected to nature, and the power of plants and horticulture in general to heal and restore. One garden entitled 'Strong Beauty', created by lo Thompson for The Glasshouse Garden, stood out for me. The Glasshouse is a not-for-profit social enterprise which harnesses the benefits of horticulture and work to create second chances for women in prison. Through nurturing, creating and maintaining indoor plants in offices for corporate clients, women gain skills, grow in self-belief, improve employability and can begin to plan for a better future. We heard the stories of lives being changed for the better, of women finding hope when they thought they'd come to the end of the road, and all through the power of being immersed in nature and working in an environment where nurture and nature are the focus. One of the women helped by the project wrote, "The Glasshouse found me at the lowest point in my life when I'd lost who I was and what I stood for in life. They provided me with a nurturing environment, helped me to see there was hope and encouraged me to be me again, a person who has a lot to offer, who has skills and eagerness to learn new things, a mother, a wife, and a person capable of amazing things."

Listening to the stories of women helped by the Glasshouse project reminded me of the Church's calling to sow seeds of hope, to bring healing and wholeness to lives which have been damaged along the way by life's experiences, to empower the weak and listen to those who have lost their way, and to bring beauty, joy and fullness of life where all feels barren, dark and sterile. Sometimes it feels as though the Church has lost her way, we've forgotten who we are and whose we are and, like the women the Glasshouse project supports, are in need of a little more selfbelief, our faith grounded more securely in the rich soil of Church tradition, fed by theological learning and spiritual insight, refreshed by the joy and light of worshipping God together in a diverse community of sinners and saints. At our recent PCC away day we recognised that one of the barriers to us growing as a Church is our lack of confidence - our hesitance in sharing the gospel because we feel we don't know our bible well enough, or our worry that others may not feel our prayer life is strong enough. And yet we are all learners and growers, we are all searchers and seekers, whether we've been attending church for a life-time or just a few weeks. We should believe in ourselves because the miracle is that God believes in us, and calls us to go out and sow seeds of love and hope and joy and light in our little patch. We are, after all, the Church which, through our faith in the risen and ascended Jesus Christ, believes wholeheartedly in second chances (and plenty more besides!) and the self-belief which comes with knowing that we are loved beyond our weaknesses, beyond our doubting, beyond the limits we set on ourselves and on others, beyond all doubt, even beyond death. And that is very definitely something worth sharing. Faith is like a beautiful garden which when sown and nurtured, weeded, watered, fed and supported, will bring joy, colour and hope to all who come within its walls.
