Dear Friends,

On Sunday Bishop Christopher will confirm six members of St Mary's congregation during the Team service when we will be celebrating the faith and witness of St Mary Magdalene herself. It seems a very appropriate day to bear witness to personal faith as well as corporate belief and identity, and for many of the candidates the journey to this very significant point has taken a while and been more of a slow burn and a gradual realisation than a sudden blinding conversion. And that is how it is for most of us, a journey of ups and downs, doubt and certainties, fears and distractions, awe and wonder alongside the mundane and the ordinary. One thing is certain about this walk with Christ and with each other, it takes commitment and a certain doggedness to keep going when we feel the Church has let us down, or our fellow travelling companions have made decisions we don't or can't agree with. But the Church is a family after all, and living in a family involves a lot of love and joy alongside compromise, forgiveness, patience, compassion and tolerance. And I am sure that Mary Magdalene experienced her journey in much the same way; she was human after all and lived a life which, given the culture and societal norms of the time, would have been particularly challenging as a woman, albeit a woman of means able to support not just herself financially, but along with some of the other women who followed Jesus, able to fund the disciples' ministry and after the resurrection to support the early Church in getting the word out there and relevant. And we know from what the gospels tell us, and particularly what Luke tells his dear Theophilus in the book of Acts, that living together in community is not always plain sailing or joyful. But we strive to make it so regardless, because that's what disciples of Christ do.

And I want to say to anyone who is thinking of making a commitment to Christ and his Church whether that's through confirmation or perhaps wanting to use the opportunity on Sunday to recommit to their own slow-burn with the memory of their confirmation in the dark and distant past, that it's the 'trying to' which will make all the difference. It's the desire, the wanting to take another step forward, responding to that still small voice, the gentle tug of the heart, to follow Jesus more closely, this is what matters to God. Not that we get it right, or that we know our bible better, or pray more religiously, or feel ourselves to be worthy enough (none of us is worthy!), what matters to God is that we want to. Because the Holy Spirit will help us with the rest.

We can choose, as the confirmation candidates have, to say yes to God's invitation to come closer and be part of the divine life of the Trinity, and we will learn - as we find a little courage and learn to trust a little more - to depend on God's surprising love and grace and now and again when we are least expecting it, we may be blown away by its power and beauty. And like Mary Magdalene, our journey will be enriched and strengthened by the love, companionship, support and encouragement of each another, of our brothers and sisters who are also walking the road alongside us, not just here in Richmond, in this diocese, but all across the world. The road can be long and hard, but it should also be full of joy and hope, mercy and love.

A deepening and abiding faith which will sustain us and hold us through good and bad is God's gift to each one of us, and we will remind each other of the beauty and enabling power of this gift on Sunday as we witness to growing faith and the joy of life lived in and for God and for each other.
