Dear Friends,

One of our nation's favourite hymns, 'Guide Me O Thou Great Redeemer', is sung to the Welsh tune 'Cwm Rhondda', composed by John Hughes, a devout Christian from the mining town of Pontypridd in Rhondda Cynon Taf, South Wales. Like so many children of his generation in South Wales (he was born in 1873) John began working in the mines when he was 12 years old, and gradually worked his way up to a managerial role, but it was for his faith and his music that he is best remembered. Music has the ability to speak for us in ways words just can't, and Cwm Rhondda is loved as much for the stirring tune as for its lyrics, written by another Welshman William Williams.

I mention John Hughes because the chapel where he wrote his famous hymn tune has been in the news this week. Due to the decline in church attendance the Chapel has fallen on hard times and the Baptist Union cannot afford to carry out much needed repairs to the building to keep it open. The Chapel is now up for sale - it can be yours for the princely sum of £47,000. John wrote Cwm Rhondda to celebrate the Chapel's anniversary in 1907 during it's heyday, and I don't expect he imagined then that the Christian faith would one day be in decline in South Wales, and the numbers coming to worship would drop so dramatically, that the Chapel would become redundant and be sold for housing.

There is hope that the Chapel will be bought now by the community to be used as a community centre – one local lady expressed sadness at the loss of the building as a chapel, but said that what was needed now was not religion but social enterprise and a place for lonely people to meet, which struck me not just as sad but a missed opportunity by the church, which really ought to be at the centre of a community offering hope and a place to belong and be known and be seen. As the daughter of a Yorkshire miner, I know how central the church was in my childhood – Anglican, Methodist and Baptist communities thriving in the town around the pits where my dad worked. Life was hard and the church was at the centre of social cohesion, especially when disaster struck and the community was grieving and in pain. That the Church is not needed now in an area where it was so strong and Christianity had such a strong and vital influence is sadly a sign of our times.

There is a warning in this for all of us who are tempted to believe that our heritage will save us, that our churches will be safe because they are historic buildings, have beautiful artwork or stained glass or magnificent organs, or because great things once happened inside them or for them, or the great and the good worshipped there. The reality is that unless our churches are home to a living, breathing, active Church community with Christ at the centre, they will die and our heritage sold for a pittance. As St Mark might say, we have much to do and no time to waste, if we are to bring Christ back to the centre of community life, and be the outward facing, mission focussed disciples he calls us to be.

So today, why not find a recording of John Hughe's hymn tune online, and use the lyrics written by William Williams to prayerfully ask for guidance for our Team's wellbeing and ministry as we journey together through the next few months of vacancy and strive to make Christ known in Richmond in our own day and age:

'Guide me, O thou great Redeemer, Pilgrim through this barren land; I am weak, but thou art mighty; Hold me with thy powerful hand: Bread of Heaven, bread of heaven, Feed me now and evermore.'
