**Church, Community and other news:**

**NEW: Beam Work St Mary Magdalene**

We are hoping to recommence work on the beam next week, Tuesday 12 August. We are still waiting for an emergency faculty for the additional works identified but hopefully this will not delay the works starting.

The work is estimated to take 8 weeks followed by redecorating. We hope to keep the Church open as much as possible but there may be occasions when for safety reasons it will need to be closed. We will update progress and planned closures during the week in this Newsletter. The builders have our permission to close the church at any time that they feel there is a safety issue so please follow their instructions. Please avoid cordoned off areas.

The Church will be open for all Sunday Services.

### **Parish Rooms Update**

The PRWG are pleased to bring the good news that (having secured the necessary go-ahead from the Council in July), construction work will start on site on 18th August. The build is expected to take about a year.

We hope to maintain good relations with the local community. The PRWG will be contacting all the near neighbours before 18th August, to brief them on the project. Thereafter, the main contractor will distribute an introductory letter to the neighbours, followed by a monthly update. In addition, the site hoarding design will include an RTM-branded description of the project and regular progress postings from the contractor.

The whole project is being managed by our professional design team (including our architect and quantity surveyor) together with the main contractor. The Parish Office will not be involved in management of the project. ## **Church Services:**

**St John the Divine's** Sunday service at 11.00am is both in-person and live-streamed via their [Facebook page](#). St John's midweek service takes place on Tuesday evenings with half an hour of quiet contemplation focused on the Blessed Sacrament at 6.30pm, followed by the Said Eucharist at 7.00pm. The last Tuesday of the month our regular Said Eucharist at 7pm is a Eucharist for Healing and Wholeness, with the opportunity to receive the Ministry of Laying on of Hands with Prayer and Anointing for yourself or to receive it on someone else's behalf.
