Dear Friends,

I am delighted to let you know that we will be running the Alpha Course at St John the Divine beginning on Monday 22nd September.

For those unfamiliar, Alpha is a simple and hospitable way of exploring the Christian faith. Each session begins with food and conversation, followed by a short film exploring one of the big questions of life and faith – Who is Jesus? How does God guide us? Why and how do I pray? After the film, there is time to talk openly in small groups. No question is too simple or too difficult, and everyone is welcome to share their perspective.

Alpha began nearly thirty years ago at Holy Trinity, Brompton, in London, and since then it has spread around the world. Today it runs in more than 100 countries and across every major Christian denomination. It is offered not just in churches, but also in prisons, schools, universities, and workplaces, helping people from all walks of life to encounter the Christian faith in a welcoming and accessible way. Millions have taken part, many discovering faith for the first time, others finding their faith deepened and renewed.

The apostle Peter urges us to "Always be ready to make your defence to anyone who demands from you an account of the hope that is in you; yet do it with gentleness and reverence" (I Peter 3.15). Jesus himself promised, "I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly" (John 10.10).

At its heart, Alpha is about evangelisation. Evangelisation simply means "sharing the Good News of Jesus Christ" – offering the message of God's love, forgiveness, and new life to others. It is not about winning arguments, but about invitation, welcome, and witness. Pope St John Paul II put it beautifully: "Faith is strengthened when it is given to others" (Redemptoris Missio, 2). Pope Benedict XVI added: "The Church does not engage in proselytism. Instead, she grows by 'attraction" (Homily at the Inauguration of the Aparecida Conference, 2007).

It's worth saying a word about language too. Evangelisation is the activity of sharing the Gospel. Evangelical, on the other hand, refers to a particular Christian tradition that places strong emphasis on the authority of Scripture, the cross of Christ, and the need for personal conversion. Evangelisation belongs to the whole Church – Catholic, Anglican, Orthodox, Evangelical, and beyond. Alpha itself is used across all these traditions, and in that sense, it is a gift to the whole Body of Christ.

Alpha is not a lecture course or a test of knowledge; it is about sharing food, friendship, and honest conversation. It is a safe space to bring questions and doubts, and to listen to one another.

I would love you to support our Alpha in three ways:

- Pray please pray for the team, for those who will come, and for the Spirit's work in our parish through this course.
- Invite think about a friend, neighbour, or colleague who might appreciate an invitation. Alpha is a gift to share.
- Come if you have never done Alpha, or if you'd like a refresher, please consider joining us.

Together let's make this an opportunity for our parish to welcome new people, deepen faith, and discover again the richness of life in Christ.

Whether you've done Alpha before or are completely new to it, we'd love your help in making it a welcoming and fruitful time for all involved.


