


# GREEN UPDATES FROM RTM

## **WALK TO CHURCH SUNDAY – 22 June**

Did you remember to walk (or cycle or bus) to church on the 22 June as a way of recognising Clean Air Day?

Richmond is one of the greenest boroughs in London with an ever-expanding cycling network and sustainable public transport system. However, Richmond has the highest

car ownership in the whole of London. It is estimated  $2/3^{rd}$  of all journeys in London could be undertaken in less than 20 minutes on foot or by bike!! There are 460000 journeys made by car every day in Richmond – so we could do over 300000 of those by bike or by foot – not only improving air quality but improving our own health through physical activity and saving money at the same time.







# THE FACULTY FOR THE NEW BELLS AT ST MARY'S

The bellringers at St Mary's have been working on a project for many years to improve the St Mary's ring of eight bells and finally the Faculty (which gives permission for the project) has been received! How is this **GREEN** you might be asking? Well, our largest bell, weighing almost a ton, will be melted down and recast as part of the new ring of bells. Ultimate up-cycling and zero waste! Work on the project will now have to begin in earnest to fundraise all the money required with an aim of completing the work within two years.

#### **SCRUBBIES SUPPORT our STEINWAY!**

Jutta has been crocheting eco-friendly dishwashing 'scrubbies', and Phili, her daughter who runs "Naked Larder", a plastic and packaging-free grocery business based in Herne Hill, South London, has been selling them through her shop. It is a perfect partnership, as these reusable cotton 'scrubbies' are a sustainable alternative to plastic sponges and last much longer. Thanks to both of their hard work, they raised an impressive £142 for the Steinway Model D!





To learn more about "Naked Larder", please visit www.nakedlarder.co.uk. It makes very interesting reading! Naked Larder offers communities a different, ethical, sustainable way to shop. They buy dry goods and eco-friendly cleaning products in bulk to minimise packaging and reduce cost. Customers place an order online, then collect their orders using their own reusable containers.

If you know anyone near Herne Hill - or in Sidmouth, Devon, where there's a second branch - please help to spread the word about this ethical and environmentally conscious shopping option.

And Jutta can still crochet you a 'scrubbie' - please contact her direct to place an order. These can replace your synthetic sponges and they last for much much longer. Jutta will make in any colour to suit your kitchen décor.

#### BEETLE DRIVE - TOILETS GALORE!!!!!

The Beetle Drive on 27 June was extremely successful, as well as being a lot of fun! Huge thanks to Anne and Sally for hosting us so well at St Matthias, and to all those who helped on the night.



We are delighted to say that we raised £370! #### CLIMATE AND NATURE STRATEGY

One of our Green Team members attended the launch of the LBRUT Climate and Nature Strategy in July. The Council has set a target for the council to be carbon neutral by 20230 and the Borough to be net zero by 2043 - seven years ahead of the national target!

The Richmond Climate and Nature Strategy has identified five focus areas which will drive the Council's work to reduce carbon emissions across the borough, support residents and communities to take action on climate change and prepare for a changing climate. These focus areas are:

- Buildings reducing carbon emissions from council buildings
- Travel and air increasing sustainable travel and reducing air pollution
- Nature protecting and enhancing biodiversity and green spaces
- Resources moving to a zero-waste economy
- Resilience preparing for a changing climate





#### REPAIR CAFÉ Twickenham

Not sure about you but I LOVE watching the Repair Shop on TV. Did you know we have our very own local Repair service called the Twickenham Repair Café. The group has just completed its 3000<sup>th</sup> repair.

The group offer their services monthly at St Margarets Catholic Church on the third Saturday of the month. Volunteers are on hand to help repair your loved but broken items. There are over 30 wonderful repairers who can help with any of the following:

- Clothes and textiles
- Household and garden electrical
- Electronics and radios
- Bikes, adults and kids
- Ceramics
- Computer hardware (and software advice)
- Games consoles
- Clocks and watches
- Toys
- Upholstery and furniture
- Woodwork
- Tool and knife sharpening



The service is free but donations are of course always welcome. Check out their website for more info including pictures of some the repairs they have completed - coffee grinders, clocks and even light sabres..... check out the before and after fairy! And if you take something there for repair do let us know!
