Dear Friends,

A couple of year's ago, Bea and I went on a trip to Rome, and a friendly young American Seminarian kindly showed us and a group of other tourists and pilgrims (German, Australian, American, Swedish) around St Peter's Basilica. His name was *Gerard* (with a thick Midwest accent,) and although we politely disagreed with women's ordination as we cued our way around St Peter's Square, we were having a lovely time.

As you will know, if you've been to the Vatican, everything (every stone, altar, monument, view) has a story attached. It's a place steeped in holiness and history.

Once inside, Gerard began the tour: it's a stunning building of bright and golden decoration. And in one reasonably dark side chapel, Gerard pointed to the altar and casually announced that we were in the presence of the remains of St John Chrysostom! Bea and I were so excited! Gerard was, as you may be, pleasantly amused.

St John Chrysostom was a 4th century saint, knick-named 'golden-mouthed' in Greek for his eloquence and oratory. His feast day is on Saturday, and he (along with Basil, Gregory of Nazianzus, and Athanasius) is considered one of the four Great Greek Church Fathers. His sermons are worth reading, but really Bea and I were primarily excited about the guy who wrote that prayer.

The prayer in question is prayed at every BCP Evening Prayer:

ALMIGHTY God, who hast given us grace at this time with one accord to make our common supplications unto thee; and dost promise that when two or three are gathered together in thy Name thou wilt grant their requests: Fulfil now, O Lord, the desires and petitions of thy servants, as may be most expedient for them; granting us in this world knowledge of thy truth, and in the world to come life everlasting. Amen.

"as may be most expedient for them..." "Grant their requests... as may be most expedient for them." Isn't that beautiful?

In so few words asking earnestly and sincerely, but with deep recognition of God power and authority, of God's wisdom and enduring love. It's acknowledgement that we know and comprehend so little, and yet the creator not only listens to our prayers but acts upon them.

So, think of St Chrysostom on Saturday, and pray his Golden Mouthed prayer tonight.

# NEW: Statement read out in St Mary Magdalene from Archdeacon Bridget Shepherd on Sunday 7 September at a meeting to discuss arrangements after Revd Charlie leaves

The Archdeacon writes:

As you will be aware, in June we held interviews for a new Team Rector, but were unable to appoint. Since then, work has been going on behind the scenes to consider the best way forward. I have met with the clergy and churchwardens in the parish to hear their current concerns, as well as their hopes for the future. I've also spoken with the Bishops, and with the Dean of King's College Cambridge (who is one of the patrons) to discuss possible next steps.

In the next four weeks I will be meeting with the Standing Committee and PCC to propose a suggested way forward. If the PCC are happy with this proposal, we will go through another interview process in November, with a view to having someone in post from the end of February.

Alongside this, the property team at the diocese are working hard to identify a suitable property to purchase as a new parsonage for the parish. We hope that this will also be ready for occupation by February.

I am very grateful to Charlie Middleton for her ministry during the vacancy, and to the other clergy in the team for the support they have offered. I am also very grateful to the Churchwardens at St. Mary Magdalene - John Buckingham and Anthony Bell, for all that have been doing, and for the arrangements they have made to provide cover for services over the next five months.

Whilst this may feel like an uncertain time, I am confident that God is at work bringing new life. I have a great sense of hope for the future, and pray that the next season in the life of this parish will be one in which our three churches flourish.

Please continue to pray for this parish and for the appointment of a new Team Rector. In the meantime, do think about how you can be involved in serving God at St. Mary's. I'm aware that the parish are seeking to appoint a new Treasurer, and it would be wonderful to have some new people involved in the leadership of the parish as we move into this new season.

Thank you for your partnership in the Gospel.


