This week's clergy letter comes from Bishop Martin:

Dear Fellow Pilgrims in Christ,

'Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word.' (Luke 1: 38) I am writing this from the Diocese of Matabeleland, our Link Diocese in Zimbabwe, where I am visiting to see progress on the schools we are supporting. On Tuesday, we drove for five hours on a difficult road from Victoria Falls to the new St Cecilia's secondary school in the countryside near Lupane. One of my colleagues said being in the back of the car was like having a thorough workout with a chiropractor!

As we arrived at the school site, the transformation in just a year was unbelievable. Before, we had sat under the shade of a large tree and discussed the plans for a school. Now, there are two large classroom blocks close to completion with children expected to occupy them in January. More are planned. The Mother's Union, who were accompanying us, immediately broke into a song of thanks to God for God's generous provision. I give thanks to God for the generosity of so many in the Kingston Episcopal Area in supporting my run along the Pennine Way, which enabled us to make a financial contribution to the school at a key moment. The Mother's Union bus then got stuck in the sandy soil and had to be dug out but that's another story!

As you read this, you will be advancing purposely through Advent with all that this entails! I hope it is going well. I look forward to being with at least some of you for carol and Sunday services, for midnight mass, and, of course, Christmas morning in HMP Wandsworth.

Above, I invoke the words of Mary to the angel as told in Luke's gospel. These words have been my companion in recent days – Mary's yes to God which is also the yes to God of all baptised Christians. I think also of the 200 people I have confirmed this year – a big increase on last year. It has been so encouraging to see new faith and commitment visibly blossoming before my eyes. And Mary's words also speak into my own sense of commitment and call, seeking to live this out faithfully as your bishop.

In February, on the Feast of Candlemas, I will have been Bishop of Kingston for three years – can you believe it?! It has felt an appropriate time to take stock, to revisit priorities, and to give thanks to God for all that has been. What I have noticed is that while new and unexpected things have bubbled to the surface – teaching and learning, a commitment to growing confidence in the faith, the importance of the Link with Matabeleland – some of the things I began with remain current. One of the first things I said when I arrived was that I wanted to be present, alongside and accessible to parishes and clergy. This feels as important as ever and remains at the heart of all I do. I continue to enjoy getting to know people and places and feeling ever more at home in Southwark. While life is not always easy or straightforward, being in relationship with you, sharing in ministry with you, seeking to discern God's prompting together is a privilege I continue to relish.

One of the things I have been doing in 2025 with my immediate team – Bridget, Charlie, Hannah, Simon and Vanessa – is exploring how we want to be with each other. That is, exploring what the values are that we wish to govern what we do. After much discussion, we came up with the following:

In the Kingston Episcopal Area, we aspire to grow in confidence in God, the Church and one another.

To do this we seek to:

- Build strong and healthy relationships
- Cultivate an attitude of curiosity and learning

- Be honest and **transparent** in our dealings (i.e. being straightforward)
- Encourage creativity and openness to new ways of doing things
- Be **effective** in getting things done while working in a sustainable manner

Therefore, the KEA team seeks to be relational, transparent, curious, creative and effective.

But these values are not just about how we wish to be with each other. They are also how we commit to interacting with yourselves – with parishes, schools and chaplaincies – and the wider Diocese. Of course, values are no good if they just remain on paper. They have to be lived. We commit to trying to live these values out in our dealings with you. We will not always get it right but we hold ourselves accountable to these values and, if you are willing, we commend them to you as well. I like to think we are trying to model something distinctive in the Kingston Episcopal Area, particularly to create a climate in which all voices are encouraged, that people know they will be listened to and taken seriously wherever we end up.

Earlier this week, I had the honour of sharing in the dedication and consecration of a new church, St Cecilia's Nzwananzi, not far from the school we are supporting. My name is even on the cornerstone, which is a first for me! During the celebration of Holy Communion, which was a wonderful celebration with singing that would have made St Cecilia proud, the Bishop of Matabeleland, the Rt Revd Cleophas Lunga, distributed the host with the words 'Become what you are, the Body of Christ'. It struck me as a lovely phrase, capturing that sense that Christian discipleship is about growing into what we already are, our true selves in Christ, how God has made us to be. Just as I am greatly encouraged by all that I see in the Kingston Episcopal Area, I hope that you too will take encouragement from what you are part of – perhaps particularly a sense of being part of something bigger, which is always driven home to me when I visit Matabeleland. May we indeed 'become what we are' not forgetting the values I and my team have committed to!

As Advent turns to Christmas, I wish you a peaceful and restful one, hope and courage for the journey ahead, and I thank you for all you do.

The bells of St Mary Magdalene

The bells of St Mary Magdalene are to undergo a dramatic transformation. The three most historic bells dating from 1680 are to be incorporated into a brand-new ring of eight bells that will be faithful to the presence of centuries past while bringing a new sound to the town. The work, that is planned to begin next year, will help future-proof the art of bell ringing and maintain the unique music of church bells in Richmond.

With a target of £200,000 the Richmond ringers will lead the fund-raising effort and are hoping that some benefactors will be prepared to sponsor one of the five new bells that will have the potential to be inscribed with names and messages that could last for hundreds of years. Diocesan News:

A Message from The Bishop of Southwark, The Rt Revd Christopher Chessun

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

As we begin the Church's year and the wonderful season of Advent, so full of promise and hope, I share with you that His Majesty The King has graciously consented to my request to retire on my seventieth birthday in August next year. I have had the privilege of serving this Diocese for over twenty years in two episcopal roles, and of sharing the cure of souls with the many excellent clergy who hold my licence. I am mindful of all that you have given generously and sacrificially, as clergy and lay people, to strengthen partnerships in the Gospel in the parishes and ministries to which you have been called. I thank God for you daily, and ask for your prayers in these concluding months.

I shall be nominating Bishop Rosemarie as Acting Bishop of Southwark, to work with the Diocesan College of Bishops. A year ago when I was convalescing, greatly encouraged by your prayers and good will, Bishop Rosemarie convened the College of Bishops with authority and grace in an uncertain time. I ask for prayers for her during the Vacancy in See, and also for my esteemed colleagues Bishop Martin and Bishop Alastair. I shall hand the Diocesan crozier to Bishop Rosemarie at my final service at Southwark Cathedral on

Saturday 18 July 2026 at 12 noon and I am confident that she will lead a senior team that is well prepared for this change – it is a brilliant and effective team.

During my time in Southwark I have very much enjoyed leading diocesan and co-leading ecumenical pilgrimages, particularly to the Holy Land. In recent years I have a very strong sense of how important the reality and metaphor of journey and pilgrimage is in the Christian Faith. It is the Way, as we seek together to understand God's loving purposes for us, to speak well of each other, and to honour our Baptism and participation in Christ.

I have a heartfelt desire, God willing, to continue to serve Christ's Church, but my own personal sense of pilgrimage is captured in Walter Raleigh's poem, 'The Passionate Man's Pilgrimage':

Give me my scallop shell of quiet, My staff of faith to walk upon, My scrip of joy, immortal diet, My bottle of salvation, My gown of glory, hope's true gage, And thus I'll take my pilgrimage.

It has been a privilege to make my pilgrimage with you over these years. You have been hearty companions. I am confident that in God's providence there will be joy and sustenance for each and every Southwark pilgrim in the faithful years to come, the Lord himself being our helper.
