Dear Friends,

At Sunday's Eucharist we will hear St Matthew's account of the part Joseph played in the Incarnation of our Lord (Matthew I:18-end), a timely reminder of how important it is to reflect on Joseph's calling to love and protect Mary at the most pivotal and dangerous time in her very young life. We know that Mary would only have been around 14 years of age when she experienced that awesome visit from Gabriel and was told the earth-shattering news that she was to carry and give birth to the Son of God. We will reflect much more on Mary as the coming week unfolds, but for now we spend time with Joseph as he struggles to grasp the reality of what it is that God is asking of him. We know, as Joseph did, that the sentence for committing adultery in first century Palestine was to be stoned to death — without Joseph's 'yes' to God, we can only imagine how different the world, and our lives, might be now.

The crazily beautiful Basilica de la Sagrada Familia in Barcelona is dedicated to Saint Joseph; the cornerstone was laid on his feast day (19th March) in 1882. Joseph features prominently in the Nativity façade, his presence carved in stone, interwoven through the scenes from Jesus' childhood. This incredible place of worship is still a work in progress, and there are plans for Joseph to be given a resting place in the Glory scenes which will bring this awesome Gaudi creation to completion. If you haven't had a chance to visit this inspiring Cathedral then why not have a look online and read its fascinating history, and the people who have had a hand in bringing this sacred project to birth.

We too are a work in progress, human beings living out that deep Advent truth that the Kingdom comes to earth now in and through us whenever we say our 'yes' to God; and yet the future reality is still to come, the glory of the promise which is ours in Christ still to be made fully present. As we lean into this final week of Advent our cry is all the more urgent: 'Come, O Come Emmanuel'!

St John the Divine's Sunday service at 11.00am is both in-person and live-streamed via their Facebook page. St John's midweek service takes place on Tuesday evenings with half an hour of quiet contemplation focused on the Blessed Sacrament at 6.30pm, followed by the Said Eucharist at 7.00pm. NEW: Theft at the Museum of Richmond

The Museum of Richmond can confirm that the theft of nine artefacts from its collection took place on 6th December 2025. The historic pieces were on loan from St Mary Magdalene Church and Richmond Charities (Hickey's Almshouses Chapel) and include precious items such as a pair of Charles II silver flagons, a William III Britannia silver tazza (cup), and a Charles II silver sideboard plate.

We are deeply saddened by this appalling act and are working closely with the local authorities and the police to provide our full support to the ongoing investigation. In parallel, we are reviewing our security procedures in partnership with lenders to ensure that all loaned items continue to receive the highest level of care and protection.

These historic pieces represent an important part of Richmond's heritage, and their loss is felt profoundly by the Museum, Richmond Team Ministry, Richmond Charities and the community. We urge anyone with information that may assist the investigation to contact the police.
