Dear Friends,

Anticipation is growing this week as preparations for Jaquie Binns' art and embroidery exhibition at St Matthias are in the final stages. We are looking forward to welcoming visitors to St Matthias over the weekend of 13-15th February and to celebrate with Jaquie her 40 years as an ecclesiastical artist and embroiderer. The exhibition coincides with our Patronal Festival and our preacher on Sunday 15th February at the 9.30am Eucharist will be Bishop Richard Harries, a retired bishop of Oxford and a much appreciated speaker on Radio 4's Thought for the Day.

Art, like music, has a way of speaking to our hearts and souls in ways words cannot. An image doesn't have to be religious to speak to us of God, I have often used secular paintings to illustrate a sermon or to accompany a meditation. Scenes of nature, especially of beautiful landscapes, have the ability to lift our mood and point us to something beyond ourselves. When we can't find the words to express joy, grief, awe, confusion, wonder, art speaks for us, it illuminates our emotions and can foster a deeper connection to God.

Artistic expression, especially if it's in a medium which we are not familiar with, can challenge us to see the world and each other in a new light. Earlier this week I visited St Marylebone Church to see an exhibition of paintings which make up 14 Stations of the Cross, all created by the priest artist Jean Lamb. The images were a contemporary and unusual take on a very traditional way of engaging with Jesus' journey to the cross, and it took me a while to get my head around them. But once I settled in to the space and allowed the artist herself to move me to see Calvary in a different light I was blown away and I know that what I discovered will keep me company - and keep me pondering - in the coming weeks as we prepare to enter Lent and journey with Jesus to the cross.

The exhibition is sadly finished, but I will be using Jean's images to illustrate the Stations of the Cross at St Matthias on the Monday of Holy Week (at 6.30pm), so I hope you will feel encouraged to put that date in your diary. You will be able to walk the Stations of the Cross at services in all three churches in Holy Week this year: at St Matthias on Monday 30th March, at St John's on Tuesday 31st March and at St Mary's on Wed 1st April – why not engage with each evening's offerings this year and delve a little deeper in to all that Holy Week has to offer.

I hope you will come along to St Matthias next weekend, and take time to explore Jaquie's 40th anniversary exhibition, and meet the artist herself. There will be 50 pieces of art on display, a mix of embroidery, painting and sculpture, all unique expressions of faith and a great celebration of the God-given gifts of artistic interpretation and imagination.
